Jesus emphasized this point with "The Parable of the Unjust Judge" (Luke 18:18), pointing out that if someone like the unjust judge would respond to persistence, certainly our loving God will respond to our prayers if we pray with faith. The Lord has told us we can come boldly to Him (Hebrews 4:16).
