**Monday: Faron Thebeau** is a third-generation pastor who has been serving Mosaic FWB Church in Rolla, Missouri, since 2017. He also pastored Primera Iglesia Bautista Libre (TX), Evergreen FWB Church (TX), and Bismarck FWB Church (MO). Faron is passionate about cross-cultural ministry. He has served as a pastor of a bilingual church, and has helped translate for mission trips to Mexico and Cuba. He and his wife Abigail have three children: Itziar, Truman, and Dominic.

**Tuesday: Amos Dillard** is the lead church planter at City Lights Church in Chula Vista, California, located between San Diego, California, and Tijuana, Mexico. Involved in church planting since 2015, Amos previously served at Grace City Church in Irvine, California. Amos and his wife Melissa have three kids: Ellie Mae, Addison, and Aiden.

**Wednesday: Ken Cash** graduated from Welch College in 1987 with a degree in Christian education. He and his wife Jayne have since ministered in five Free Will Baptist churches, four in North Carolina and one in Tennessee. Ken also served as a member of the North Carolina State Youth Board. Approved as career missionaries to Bulgaria in May 2020, Ken and Jayne currently serve in the city of Veliko Tarnovo, Bulgaria. ## North American Ministries Celebrates 85 Years

In response to a growing concern for planting churches in North America, the Free Will Baptist Home Missions Board was formed at the second National Convention held in Bryan, Texas, in 1938. In the decades following, the Lord faithfully provided for the department, which has seen remarkable growth and touched countless lives with the hope of the gospel.

Today, Home Missions (renamed North American Ministries in 2015) has 84 active mission works in 23 states, Mexico, the U.S. Virgin Islands, and Puerto Rico. North American Ministries is the endorsing agent for Free Will Baptist chaplains who minister to service men and women in the armed forces. Currently, 14 chaplains and their families are proudly serving the nation.

With innovative financial programs such as the Church Extension Loan Fund (established in May 1982), numerous free resources, and training events aimed at revitalizing churches, bolstering pastors, and meeting the physical and spiritual needs of local communities, North American Ministries has proven it is still passionate about seeing new churches established and existing churches thrive.

Though church planters continue to start churches nationwide, under the direction of Dr. David Crowe, executive director since 2014, North American Ministries has turned its attention westward and northward, seeking to establish churches in the great metropolitan areas of the Northeast and the rapidly growing cities throughout the West.
