# FINDING HOPE IN THE

The lack of evangelism is a problem for the North American church. Last year, research by Dr. Thom Rainer of Church Answers discovered **only 4% of churches have any type of evangelistic outreach**, and less than 1% of churches have a year-round evangelistic outreach approach.

As a result, Rainer began to develop **The Hope Initiative**, which uses prayer and Scripture as the foundation. He concluded that, to be successful, this approach would need to be efficient, taking less than 20 minutes a day for participants.

Because it is difficult to engage the entire congregation in the revitalization process, The Hope Initiative seeks to change the culture of a church 3-5 participants at a time over a 12-month time period.

Dr. Rainer asked Free Will Baptists to partner in the development of this new initiative. As the year went by, our churches that participated in the beta testing discovered The Hope Initiative works. Rainer expressed his thankfulness for these churches, noting, "I am confident God will use their desire to be obedient to the Great Commission to reach many people for Christ, and that many of their churches will see abundant fruit in the days ahead."

## MAKING AN IMPACT ON RALEIGH

IMPACT had another great turnout as 80 Free Will Baptist volunteers from across the country arrived a day early to help make an impact on Raleigh! This year, teams worked in three locations: **Shady Grove FWB Church, Haven FWB Church,** and **With Love From Jesus Ministries.** 



Haven hosted a free car wash and a cookout complete with a bounce house for kids. Forty people showed up to help at this location. "IMPACT at Haven was a great success!" noted Impact Director Ken Akers. "We washed more than 20 cars, which meant we made more than 20 new contacts for the church."

While the cars were being washed, visitors enjoyed hotdogs, and children enjoyed the bounce house. One of the church members from Haven said, "It was so encouraging just to have people from the convention come and help."

With Love From Jesus Ministries reaches both Wake and Johnston counties, offering needed food and clothing to the community. They also offer furniture whenever possible. Twenty-five volunteers gathered Saturday morning to sort produce and perishables for distribution.

Shady Grove FWB Church hosted a community outreach. Fifteen church members and visiting volunteers delivered flyers to a large housing complex to let the surrounding community know more about the church. Pastor Tim Mc-Creight said, "We were excited to have everyone here, and we appreciate them coming to help us."

When asked why they continue to return to IMPACT every year, perennial volunteers Mark and Marcia McCarty (OH) answered with a chuckle: "We are gluttons for punish-



ment!" Then, more seriously, they added, "We love doing this. It's a great opportunity to share the gospel and help other churches. We wouldn't miss it."
