NUMBERS MATTER!

USING NUMBERS TO ADDRESS WHAT MATTERS MOST

Be thou diligent to know the state of thy flocks, and look well to thy herds (Proverbs 27:23).

Have you ever noticed how much emphasis we place on numbers? What number is your favorite football team in the latest AP poll? How many steps have you taken today? What is your A1C? We keep track of numbers that are important to us.


God also places emphasis upon numbers. There were the 12 disciples, the 12 tribes of Israel, and even the book of Numbers. There were the number (70) of Jacob's descendants at his death (Genesis 46:27; Exodus 1:5). God told Moses to count the people in Numbers 1:2. Each number represented a person, and counting provided evidence of God's work and progress in the world.

Proverbs 27:23 teaches us to know the state of our flocks or to count them. Just like we need to know our weight or A1C number to make important health adjustments, we need to know certain numbers as a denomination to plot the course ahead. What are the numbers we need to focus on? Attendance, baptisms, and Sunday School enrollment are critical to the state of a flock. How is the NAFWB doing on the numbers that matter most and how can that help us?

Number of Congregations and Members

And the lord said unto the servant, Go out into the highways and hedges, and compel them to come in, that my house may be filled (Luke 14:23).

First, let's look at the number of churches and church members (Figure 1). Between 2010 and 2020, we lost 355 churches. Below is a graph that Ryan Burge created comparing the 2010 and the 2020 U.S. Religious Census.





Note that NAFWB congregations decreased by 16%, which tied for the second largest decrease among religious groups. In 2020, the NAFWB had a total of 2,000 congregations. We currently have 1,885 congregations. We decreased by 44 churches from 2023 to 2024. Just in the U.S., the NAFWB had 1,921 congregations in 2020, and we currently have 1,816 congregations in the U.S. We decreased by 35 U.S. churches from 2023 to 2024.

This loss of churches significantly impacts the NAFWB because of the size of our churches. Note the table below (Figure 2) of adherents per congregation developed by Ryan Burge, based on the U.S. Religious Census.





The religious group with the least adherents per congregation was the NAFWB. Adherents per congregation decreased from 95 in 2010 to 81 in 2020.

See the current membership by states in the table below. The overall membership reported last year was 110,154. That is an increase of 3,340 members from 2023. The reported average membership per church was 58, up from 55 members per church in 2023. Still, we are averaging 23 fewer members than in 2020.

We should note there were 236 churches that reported no data. Undoubtedly, this makes the numbers appear lower than they are. (See Eric Thomsen's webinar on the importance of record keeping and his book **To Honor Our Heritage**). It is hard to know specifically where the NAFWB is functioning because of this missing data.

Number of Baptisms and Sunday School Attendees

Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost (Matthew 28:19).

Certainly, a sign of church health is whether baptisms are taking place. On the next page (Figure 4), see the number of baptisms reported by state with a breakdown by average per churches.

Overall, 5,162 baptisms were reported by NAFWB churches in 2024, an average of 2.74 per church. Again, this is hopefully skewed by the eight states or districts that did not report any data.

Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, Io, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen (Matthew 28:20).

Church health is unlikely to improve unless a strong discipleship program is in place. To measure this, we looked at reported Sunday School enrollment. Overall, enrollment is reported at 41,186 and 23 per church.

What should we do?

He that observeth the wind shall not sow; and he that regardeth the clouds shall not reap (Ecclesiastes 11:4).

Focus on church attendance. Simply bringing the number of attendees per week to the attention of the congregation is likely to impact church attendance positively. For example, people who regularly weigh themselves are more likely to lose weight and adopt good health practices. Multiple examples demonstrate how focusing on something positively impacts the desired behavior.

Free Will Baptists used to focus on numbers. I remember growing up at Bethel Free Will Baptist Church in Kinston, North Carolina, where we would talk about the number of people who attended a special day or Sunday School classes. Could we return to a healthy focus on numbers?

What if we set attendance goals in our states, associations/conferences, and churches? Would you consider setting goals like this for your state, association, or church?

Action Steps

- **Pray for Your Neighbors.** Let's set goals for prayers prayed for our neighbors. We can set these goals for the NAFWB (138,905 prayers have been prayed as of this writing). States and churches can set collective goals, and congregants can make individual goals (nafwb. org/bless).
- Increase the Number of Churches that Use The Hope Initiative. The Hope Initiative works. The more evangelistic activities our people engage in, the better. Could states set goals for the number of churches that participate (nafwb.org/hope)?
- Refocus on Sunday School. D-Groups and other small group activities are wonderful.
 However, in many churches today there is no time set aside for corporate study. Let's refocus on building Sunday Schools and discipling others in the faith.
- **Pray for the Harvest and Harvesters.** If our churches are busy praying for and reaching out to their neighbors, they are more likely to grow. We must be outward focused on the needs of our community in order to reach the community. However, we must be inward focused as we pray for and look for harvesters. We lose churches because we do not have a pastor for them and must focus inward to meet those needs. Who within your church can teach a class? Who meets the criteria to be a pastor, and who might God be calling?

These are short and simple goals every church, association, state, and those of us on the national level can pursue. Let us not just *talk* about our problems or observe the wind. Let us *get to work* so we can reap the benefits that our God richly supplies in our churches, states, and associations.



Small Groups Make Big Steps

Kevin Barnett was raised in a Christian home on a family farm where his parents modeled their faith in daily life. In 2009, Kevin was ordained and surrendered to the full-time pastorate after 17 years in Agribusiness and volunteering in the church. He has spent the last nine years at Sutton FWB Church in Pocahontas, Arkansas, as the senior pastor, along with his wife Jennifer, who oversees children's discipleship at the church. His passion is to serve the Lord and help others follow Christ by understanding the meaning of being Christ's disciple and a disciplemaker in daily life. Kevin and Jennifer have two sons, Matthew (Bri) and Michael (Maddie), and one granddaughter, Violet.

Has discipleship had a prominent role in the church in the last 40 years? If so, in what way? If not, why not? As we lead in our respective congregations, another question to consider is whether evangelism leads to discipleship, or if discipleship leads to evangelism. Studies have confirmed the importance of one generation passing the faith to the next generation. What does this look like in the local church? Second Timothy 2:1-2 teaches us to entrust to others what we have learned, so they, in turn, will teach others. How do we facilitate this in the modern church, where life is filled with distractions? This session will consider Jesus' command to make disciples, reflect upon how it looks to be a Christ disciple, consider different methods to facilitate disciplemaking in the local church, and understand how this leads to evangelizing the surrounding community.
